The Arizona State Legislature adjourned *sine die* on May 26, 2020 at 11:21 AM. The following bills were passed and signed into law by Governor Douglas A. Ducey. HB 2686

(Chapter 3) Building Permits; Utilities; Restrictions; Prohibitions (Rep. Bowers)

A county or municipality requiring the issuance of a building permit is prohibited from denying a permit application based on the utility provider proposed to provide utility service to the project. A county or municipality issuing a building permit is required to ensure that all applicable permits and fees contain requirements and amounts that do not exceed the requirements and amounts for use of other utility providers and do not have the effect of restricting a permit applicant's ability to use the services of a utility provider that is capable and authorized to provide utility service.

SB 1096

(Chapter 69) Property Management Records; Residential Records (Sen. Pace)

This legislation requires property management firms to keep residential rental agreements and related documents for one year from the expiration of the rental agreement or until the rental agreement and related documents are given to the owner at the termination of any property management agreement. "Related documents" are defined to include rental applications with tenant identifying information, move-in forms and default notices. It directs required records be kept in the broker's main office or branch office, electronically or at an off-site storage location in Arizona.

SB 1096 was signed by the Governor on June 5, 2020. A.R.S. Titles Affected: 32

SB 1303

(Chapter 77) Annexation of Territory; Requirements (Sen. Pratt)

This legislation prohibits a municipality from annexing territory, if as a result, the annexation would result in an unincorporated territory that is completely surrounded by a combination of the annexing municipality and other municipalities.
